


Girls Soccer:



ALUMNI REFLECTIONS



1st Lt. John H. VanderLaan Class of 1959

John was the son of Howard and Clara VanderLaan. He graduated from SCHS and Calvin College and entered the Marine Officers' flight training in August of 1966. During training, he was fatally injured when he bailed out of his disabled jet on May 28, 1968.

Carl Kikstra Class of 1965

After graduating from South Christian High School, Carl enlisted in the U.S. Navy and proudly served in the Vietnam War for two years on the USS Okanogan. He passed away in May of 2019 in Marne, Michigan.

Thomas Bolt Class of 1964

I was drafted into the US Army in January 1966 and was trained as a helicopter mechanic, crew chief, and door gunner during the Vietnam War. I was very worried about being sent to Vietnam because helicopters were very active during this war. One morning, our commanding officer said that they were looking for a volunteer to type correspondence. Because I had taken one typing class at South, I raised my hand to volunteer. That resulted in me becoming a typist for the rest of my military career – never once getting placed on a roster to be sent to Vietnam. That one typing class may have saved my life.

So never forget that small decisions you make in life may have a major impact on your future – and you probably won't realize it until you look back over your lifetime.

I just received my most recent issue of the SCHS HILITES. I was especially drawn to the Veterans Recognition page and the story of Mr. John Hendriske.
